

Examination regulations, assessment and grading

Austrian Grading Scheme	Definition
1	EXCELLENT: Outstanding performance
2	GOOD: Generally good, but with some errors
3	SATISFACTORY: Generally sound work with a number of substantial errors
4	SUFFICIENT: Performance meets the minimum criteria
successfully completed	Positive performance, where a strict differentiation is not adequate
5	UNSATISFACTORY: < 50% Substantial improvement necessary; requirement of further work
not completed	Negative performance, where a strict differentiation is not adequate
credited	Transfer credits for courses with equivalent learning outcomes (previous education, other university etc.) which are successfully completed

Grades for comprehensive examinations	
Austrian Grading Scheme	Definition
"mit ausgezeichnetem Erfolg bestanden"	Pass with distinction (in case of excellent performance)
"mit gutem Erfolg bestanden"	Pass with merit (in case of performance that is well above average)
"bestanden"	Pass (in case of positive assessment)
"nicht bestanden"	Fail (in case of negative assessment)
